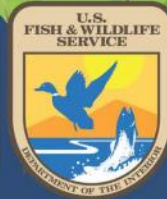

Overseeding

Tips for Dust Control

Overseeding and Air Quality

Scalping existing Bermuda grass prior to overseeding can impact air quality by generating dust. Each year the Maricopa County Air Quality Department (MCAQD) responds to questions and concerns from landscapers, golf course managers, and residents regarding the dust created prior to the overseeding process.



Do I Need a Permit?

Generally overseeding/scalping projects do not require a dust control permit. However, dust emissions generated during these projects are still regulated under MCAQD rules.

- Follow dust control measures to prevent dust emissions.
- Prevent dust emissions from crossing the property line to avoid noncompliance.

What are Dust Control Measures?



Apply water prior to scalping and as needed during mowing.

Apply water or cover piles of grass clippings.

Tips to Help Prevent Dust



Avoid scalping on windy days and on High Pollution Advisory days.



Don't over-dry the area prior to scalping.



Apply water to moisten the area prior to scalping.



Reduce the depth of scalping.



Keep dust collection screens and filters in good working order.



Moisten material piles before loading into dumpsters.



Sweep loose debris from paved surfaces instead of leaf blowing.



Reduce the area to be overseeded.

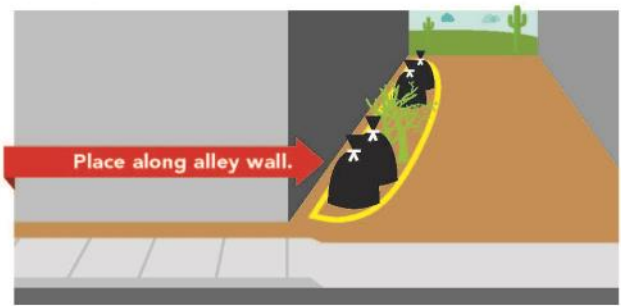
BULK TRASH PLACEMENT

If you have curbside collection, crews will only pick up piles placed close to the edge of the property. Crews can only reach up to 5 feet onto your property. Do not place piles near fixed objects.



Do not place piles on top of water meters.

If you have alley collection, place pile in the alley along your property line only. Avoid touching wall and blocking alley access.



IMPORTANT SERVICE DATES

Note these changes:

- ✓ Cut tree trimmings down to less than 12" in diameter and 4' in length.
- ✓ Place broken down cardboard in your recycle container.

DON'T INCLUDE:

- ✗ More than 20 cubic yards in your pile, which is similar to the size of a SUV.
- ✗ More than 25 pounds of construction and/or demolition waste.
- ✗ Household hazardous waste (HHW), such as antifreeze, pool chemicals, oil, batteries and paint.
- ✗ Tires, any shape or size.
- ✗ Appliances that use refrigerants.
