

- Don't dart out in front of parked cars






- It is illegal to pass a school that is stopped to load or unload

- Lighten the load
- Wear both straps
- Wear the backpack over the strongest mid-back muscles
- Use proper lifting techniques
- Reflective material enhances the visibility of the child to drivers
- Multiple compartments better distribute the weight

## Fallen Officers for the Month of August - Honoring their Sacrifice



On July 1, 1982, Officer Ignacio G. Conchos #2853 and Detective John Davis #1841 were shot attempting to locate a bank robbery suspect inside a bar at 44 E. Southern Avenue. Both officers were wounded when the suspect started shooting inside the bar. Officer Conchos died that day. Detective Davis battled his injuries for over a month before succumbing to his wounds on August 6, 1982.

Officer Conchos had been selected by the Veterans of Foreign War Post 720 as Outstanding Policeman of the Year. Officer Conchos was 39 years old and had been on the department for seven years. He was survived by his wife and four children.

Detective Davis was 48 years old and had been on the department for 12 years. He was survived by his wife and two children.



On August 28, 2004, Officer Eric White #7275 and Officer Jason Wolfe #7215 responded to a call of a shooting at 1905 West Las Palmaritas Drive. After evacuating surrounding apartments, officers attempted to make contact with the suspect. As the officers forced entry into the apartment they were immediately met by gunfire. Both Officer White and Wolfe sustained fatal gunshot wounds.

Officer White was 30 years old and had been on the department for four and half years. He is survived by his wife and two children.

Officer Wolfe was 27 years old and had been on the department for four and half years. He is survived by his wife and two sons.

## What is Storm Water Pollution? (PRC's Mother Earth Corner)

Stormwater pollution is what happens when the runoff from rainstorms flows over roads and sidewalks and picks up harmful materials. The water then drains into stormwater sewers and is not treated or cleaned up which means the pollution stays in the water. Some things that pollute the water are dirt, motor oil, fuel, grease, paints and solvents, litter and pet waste. If you want to help keep the water clean, you can sweep dirt off sidewalks around your home so it doesn't get washed into the storm drains. You can also make sure that you recycle any motor oil or antifreeze at auto parts stores. Finally, be sure to dispose of your hazardous materials (like paint) properly. This map has locations where you can recycle different things. The red square is the location of the landfill where you can take all your household hazardous waste.



Contaminación de las aguas pluviales es lo que sucede cuando el escurrimiento de las lluvias fluye por caminos y veredas y recoge materiales nocivos. Entonces, el agua drena hacia las alcantarillas de aguas pluviales y no se trata o se limpió - lo que significa que la contaminación se queda en el agua. Algunas de las cosas que contaminan el agua son la suciedad, el aceite de motor, combustible, grasa, pinturas y solventes, basura y desechos de las mascotas. Si desea ayudar a mantener el agua limpia, puede barrer la suciedad de las aceras alrededor de su casa para que no se lavan en el drenaje pluvial. También puede asegurarse de que usted recicla el aceite del motor y el anticongelante en las tiendas de autopartes. Por último, asegúrese de disponer de los materiales peligrosos (como la pintura) correctamente. Este mapa tiene lugares donde se puede reciclar cosas diferentes. El cuadro rojo es la ubicación del relleno sanitario donde se puede tomar todos sus desechos domésticos peligrosos.


