



Valle del Sol - Fidencio



Before coming to Valle del Sol for help with his drug use, Fidencio said his life was “a wreck.”

“I would see people living regular, normal lives and would just wonder how they did it,” he said. “I really wanted to have a normal life too.”

In addition to his drug use, which caused him to feel sick and tired all of the time, Fidencio was also suffering from intense headaches, the result of untreated high blood pressure. After being arrested for a parole violation on his 50th birthday, Fidencio was referred to Valle del Sol and began receiving counseling and help for his addiction.

Thanks to Valle del Sol’s Total Health: Mind, Body & Spirit, an integrated health care program, Fidencio is also being successfully treated for his hypertension at the agency’s primary health care clinic. In addition to seeing his counselor on a regular basis, Fidencio also has regularly scheduled checkups with Dr. Gordon Ahlers, who works full time at the clinic.

“My blood pressure was really high when I started coming here, but now I don’t wake up with headaches anymore,” Fidencio said.

Although he has had a couple of bumps in his road to recovery, Fidencio said he is now clean and sober and doing extremely well. He has a good, steady job and enjoys spending time with his grandchildren.

“I never spent any time with them before when I was on drugs, but now it feels so special to be with them.” Looking back over the past few years, Fidencio knows that he has come a long way in getting his life and his health back. “But I’m not done yet. I don’t ever want to go back to where I was before,” he said. “Drug addiction blinded me from everything that was good.”

“Thanks to Valle del Sol, I can now see the path that I’m on. Now I know the direction that I’m going.”

The inspiration for Total Health program began when Valle del Sol staff discovered that their behavioral health care patients were facing barriers of primary care due to transportation issues or a lack of physicians to meet their client’s primary health care needs. In addition, research shows that individuals with behavioral health issues often die younger due to untreated chronic medical illnesses such as diabetes, high cholesterol, or high blood pressure. 





Heat Island:

What is a heat island? Well, Central City South is part of a heat island. The temperature is higher in this area because when the heat from the sun reaches the ground, it reflects back instead of being absorbed by soil. Streets and buildings are very good at reflecting heat, while bare ground is good at absorbing it (and keeping the temperature down). One way to fix a heat island is to plant a lot of trees and grass. Trees and other plants will help absorb the heat that's reflected off of buildings and streets. Community gardens can also help bring down the temperature. Because we live in a desert, it is best to plant things that can grow well without a lot of water.


