New, More Equitable Ground Transportation Policy Proposed at Sky Harbor

In an effort to continue to provide world-class service to its customers, Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport is looking to implement a new ground transportation policy that will provide more transportation options for travelers and create a fair fee structure for all commercial ground transportation providers at the airport.

In fact, you may have learned from recent news accounts that the Phoenix City Council voted to approve Phoenix Sky Harbor's new Ground Transportation Policy during a Policy Meeting in early March. This proposal updates the current fee structure for commercial ground transportation providers at the airport. Currently, taxis and Super Shuttle pay a majority of the fees. The new policy would provide a more flexible framework for a variety transportation businesses at the Airport, including Uber, Lyft and other Transportation Network Companies, services that customers have been requesting at the airport.

When will this policy be put into place? It still needs to clear one more green light. The earliest that the new policy would take effect is June, 30 days after a Formal City Council vote on an ordinance change.

Under the proposed Policy, commercial ground transportation providers would pay a fee based on the number of airport pick-ups and the size of their vehicle. New providers would pay the full fee when they begin operating at the Airport. However, commercial providers who already operate at the airport would have the fees phased in over three years, beginning in 2017. The fees would help cover the cost of Sky Harbor's ground transportation program including roadway and curb maintenance and staff who work at the curbs. Sky Harbor does not receive any local tax money to operate the Airport.

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

A word from the **Councilwoman Kate Gallego**

Spring is here and already there is much to celebrate! Since the turn of the year, City Hall has been very busy. Yet, even with all the activity, it has been great to gain some great wins for the Central City South community. In particular for Central City South, complete streets are coming, vibrant community driven planning processes are kicking off, and an improved public transit system is on its way.

This past month, the City Council voted to nominate me as the Vice Mayor in Phoenix. As Vice Mayor for the City of Phoenix, I look forward to

continuing to highlight the unique assets and fighting for the residents of Central City South to receive their fair share. For District 8 this is exciting news as we continue work together to leverage more resources in improving the neighborhoods.

Through the work of community leaders and residents, the City of Phoenix has been working on bringing more walkable, pedestrian, and bike friendly complete streets to the area. From new bike lanes on Grant/ Lincoln and Central to ADA accessible sidewalks installation on Buckeye, many new street improvements are only just beginning. After meeting with residents in senior centers, parks, and neighborhood meetings, I was able to work with the Streets Department to implement an ADA accessible route on Buckeye by installing sidewalks, ramps, and lighting. Along with my colleagues of the City Council, I voted to begin the initial process for this sidewalk improvement project. This project will create ADA accessible sidewalks on the North and South side of the Buckeye from Central to 16th Street.

One of the most exciting news items for Central City South is the funding of the South Central Light Rail extension. With the unique aspects and importance of the neighborhoods along the proposed South Central extension and the passage of the Proposition 104, a voter initiative to fund improvements on light rail, buses, and streets, the South Central extension has received prioritization from the City Council in order to be finished ten years prior than the original proposed time. Along with the implementation of the South Central Light Rail extension, the United States Department of Transportation will be implementing the LadderSTEP Pilot program in the Phoenix South Central transit corridor in order to create economically sustainable neighborhoods and communities along the proposed South Central Phoenix extension.

Also of interest, the City of Phoenix Aviation Department has been going through an extensive community centric planning strategy for airport owned land in the East portion of Central City South. Over the years, the City of Phoenix Aviation Department has acquired noise impact land in close proximity to the airport through the Voluntary Acquisition and Relocation Services program. We recognize the complex history of this program, and I am well aware of the impacts the program has had on residents and neighborhoods with deep historic roots to the area. This is truly a historical and culturally unique location of Phoenix, and it is my hope that through this process we can help these neighborhoods move forward in a positive way.

As Vice Mayor of Phoenix and Councilwoman of District 8, I am so excited to continue to see new neighborhood leaders begin to mobilize and organize their communities. It is only through the hard work of volunteers, leaders, and residents that I am able to truly fight and win for the fair share of District 8. 
